



What is YFC?

YFC, or Young Farmers' Club as it is commonly known, is a nationwide organisation for people aged between 10 - 26. There is a network of over 650 clubs within England and Wales which contain nearly 22,000 members between them.

Dating back to the 1920's **YFC** has always been, and continues to be, a member run organisation. Clubs hold a meeting on a



weekly basis, where members listen to interesting

talks given on a huge range of topics, or take part in a range of activities like ice skating or stock judging, rounders or farm walks.



Young farmers is a fantastic organisation open to anyone. So if you like the sound of **YFC**, then why not give it a go?

Frequently Asked Questions.

Do you have to be a farmer to be in young farmers?

NO! **YFC** is open to absolutely anybody between the ages 10 - 26, whether or not you are a farmer.

Who runs YFC?

We do! The members of each club all help to run their own club, this is unique to **YFC!**

How long does YFC membership last for?

Membership lasts for one year, it has to be renewed yearly.

When does YFC meet?
